

# No more Petit Jean show???

Did you know that the Museum of Automobiles on Petit Jean and MOTAA are 2 different non-profit organizations? Some people think the museum is state owned and receives state funding. This is NOT so. Mr. Rockefeller formed the museum over 30 years ago. It has always run strictly on donations. MOTAA has it's headquarters in the museum and helps to keep the museum alive. The Winthrop Rockefeller Charitable Trust has approved a \$100,000 Challenge Grant for the Museum. The Challenge Grant is for one year and must be matched in full by December 31, 2007 to qualify for payment of the grant. MOTAA has taken a big part in helping to raise the matching \$100,000. As of the June car show, they had reached half of their goal. They have the rest of this year to raise the balance of the money. If the money is not raised and the grant is not given to the museum, it is very possible the museum can be taken over by the state or even closed. If that happens it is not known what will happen to the annual Petit Jean car show or the other events we enjoy which utilize the museum and Petit Jean mountain.

We of BMCA can do our small part by contributing all our pennies and dimes etc. whenever we can. We will have donation jars available at the next few events as well as at the meetings. There will also be a jar at McLeods/Lake Corvallis Yacht Club for those who have a few extra dollars to contribute. It doesn't have to be a large amount as every penny really does make a difference.
