"Yesterday I did the Jerry Lewis Telethon here in Little Rock, I was on TV once again. What a wonderful day it was. Mom, Jason and Brandy were right next to me answering the phones. We collected enough money to send 32 kids to camp this year. This puts a big smile on my face for sure."

Wrapped around this note were a few sentences saying how tired she was. But it didn't hold her back.

Her other dream was to win the Frequent Cruiser of the Year award. She returned from one such trip the day before she went into the hospital. She lived every day she was given doing something positive.

BMCA Board Meeting Minutes - November 2007

Call to order was promptly at 4:00 pm. Thanks to Ronnie for starting my minutes for me. When I arrived, the motion on the table was raising the membership dues from \$20 (present) to \$25. Further discussion changed the membership dues to \$30, because the associate dues must be 1/2 of the members. This is to cover the cost of the newsletter. But if we had to pay for our own publishing of the newsletter, inflation would get us seriously. This would make us more selfsufficient as a club, without counting on a distinct few that has helped us out in the past. (I would like to take this time to give many thanks to Jim Peckham and Ronnie McLeod and their copying machines for helping us out.) A motion to extend the 3 years for 2 paid years for the 2008 dues at the new prices were brought to the table. In the discussion, it was voted: If the cost of the dues don't pass, we will omit the 3 for 2 this next year. So for clarification...if the raising of the dues passes, we will run a 3 for 2 in 2008. We have \$125 in an envelope for the Petit Jean Museum. A motion was brought forth to increase this amount to \$200 donation, and still make the annual charity to the Union Rescue. The Petit Jean donation is a one time donation, it may not necessarily be repeated next year. We will hold onto the monies until after the November run to see if anymore \$ is added, then Lisa will write the check and get it in the mail before the end of the year. A motion was added for the club to add an additional \$50 in the BMCA name to go along with the monies collected for Petit Jean. The meeting adjourned at 4:54 pm.
