MOTAA & Petit Jean Show News

Most BMCA'ers are familiar with the June Swap Meet and Car Show as it is a special event each of us looks forward to each year. Are you aware that BMCA is one of over 20 associate members of the <u>M</u>id-America <u>O</u>ld <u>Time Auto</u> <u>A</u>ssociation, Inc.?

This year is MOTAA's 50th anniversary. MOTAA was conceived in 1958 by a group of antique car owners living in Arkansas, Missouri, Tennessee and Mississippi who found the major national antique car clubs located too far away. The concept of the organization was to bring together the several local antique car clubs in the region for mutual support and cooperation, but to allow the member clubs to retain individual autonomy. It was incorporated as a Tennessee non-profit corporation in January 1959. MOTAA is dedicated to vehicle preservation and restoration.

The June Auto Show and Swap Meet has been held on Petit Jean at the Museum of Automobiles since 1968. The museum serves as the national headquarters for MO-TAA but is a separate organization dependant on its own funding. It is not a state-funded organization and is operated only through various donations and fund-raising efforts. Although the museum is dedicated to ALL antique cars, there are usually at least one or two British beauties on display at any given time!

This years swap meet and show begins on Tuesday June 10th and continues through Saturday June 14th, the day of the car show itself. The swap meet set up begins on Tuesday and the real sales events begin on Wednesday. The mountain gets busier as the weekend draws nearer with Friday and Saturday always being the BIG days. On Friday there is a Ladies Shopping Tour of Morrilton in addition to the swap meet and craft sales on the mountain itself. You can get more details and registration information at motaa.com

Lucas Electrical - Don't let the smoke out

The wiring on early British cars runs under the car and then passes into the trunk. These wires are exposed to damage from rocks and items in the trunk. The harness is attached to the body or chassis rails with clips, and if one of these clips is knocked out of alignment by foreign objects, the clip will cut into the wires inside the harness, causing a short circuit.

The wires to the tail light and to the electric fuel pump were not fused in early 50's and 60's cars. The SU fuel pump circuit never got fused. The tail light circuit from about 1965 on started to be fused, with the fuse installed at the factory in various locations on the car - behind the panel, under the hood, etc. Later it was incorporated into the fuse box.

The damage caused by an electrical fire can be very extensive. If you want to avoid an electrical fire ("keep the smoke in the wire"), then fuse the fuel pump and tail lamp circuits. A fuse can be installed in the SU fuel pump circuit in the white (power) wire leading from under the hood to the pump. If you install the fuse close to the ignition switch on some models, you could be double fusing the circuit. Follow Figure 1 below to install an in-line fuse in the parking/tail lamp circuit in the wire close to the head light switch.

The damage that fuses in the tail light circuit can prevent is demonstrated by what happened to many MGA owners. The MGAs came by ship with wooden bumpers installed. The chrome bumpers were fitted by the local MGA distributor using unskilled warehouse personnel. When they joined the two wires to the license plate lamp, sometimes they reversed the red (power) and black (ground) wires, not knowing that the red wire always went to the tip of the bulb and the black wire went to the side. The lights would work until the paint on the lamp stopped being an insulator. Then one night, with the light on, the new MGA owner had a short circuit and major harness damage (lots of smoke out of the wires).

I have spent many hours under the dash repairing the damage caused to wiring harnesses by short circuits caused by damage to the tail light circuit. A little fuse can go a long way to insure that the smoke stays where it's supposed to!
