
Our speaker will be Bob Tucker and his talk is entitled "Who is this Jesus."

Dr. Bob Tucker is currently the Executive Director of the Foundation for Contemporary Theology. He is a member of First Unitarian Universalist of Houston, has preached in all nine of the Houston area UU churches, has been an UU Affiliate Minister, and was an Interim Minister for seven months in 2008 at FUU of Houston. Prior to retirement, for twenty–eight years, he was the Senior Minister of First Congregational Church in the

Memorial area of Houston.

He has served churches in South Dakota and Houston, and also has been an interim minister in the states of Minnesota, Kansas and Texas. He was a teacher and school administrator in Turkey for five years. For three years he served as the Director of Library Services and member of the faculty of the Houston Graduate School of Theology. He has taught courses at Rice University's Continuing Studies Department, the Women's Institute, and has preached and taught in churches of six denominations. His main volunteer work today is serving on the Board of Justice for Children.

Bob grew up in Minnesota, and has graduate degrees from the University of Chicago, the University of Minnesota and the United Theological Seminary of the Twin Cities.

The Noticer: Sometimes, All a Person Needs is a Little Perspective by Andy Andrews.


Andy Andrews is the author of the Traveler's Book. While you might have heard of that book, I had not and I picked this book up at random. It consists of a series of separate stories illustrating "truths" of life. The format consists of a mysterious old man who appears and reappears to interact with individuals and groups. There is a reader's guide of discussion question for each chapter at the end. I was reminded of *The Prophet* by Kahlil Gibran, but this book is in modern form with everyday language. However, the style is not nearly as elegant as *The Prophet*.

# **Notes From the Building Committee**

First, the building dry-in is almost complete. The fiberglass posts for the front porch have arrived at the building supply in Buffalo and Mike Watkins will pick them up tomorrow. His plans are to install them this Saturday as well as finish up some inside framing details.

Two, after paying all current and projected expenses, it appears that the dry-in cost for the building will come in at \$67,062. That is an incredibly low \$21.58 per square foot!

Three, the donors considered the building finished enough to warrant releasing the "requirement to build" provision. The document removing this requirement has been executed and filed for record at the Walker County Courthouse. The Fellowship now completely owns the land and the improvements outright.
