May 10th, 2009

Our speaker will be Daniel T. Strain and the title of his talk is "Freethought & Compassion." In a world where compassion is under assault, Freethinkers may often have difficulty seeing the connection between Freethought and compassion. DT Strain will examine some of the misconceptions about compassion, the nature of compassion, and discuss how it is not only a part of Freethought, but fundamental to it.

Daniel T. Strain is a Humanist Minister, certified by the American Humanist Association (AHA). He is also an artist

and a marketing director by profession who frequently writes on a wide variety of philosophic concepts and participates in several Humanist and Freethought organizations.

He is former president of the *Humanists of Houston* (HOH), and has served as vice-chair on the Executive Council of AHA's Chapter Assembly, and currently serves on the Education Committee of the *Kochhar Humanist Education Center*. His writings have appeared in several newsletters and in the AHA national publication *"Essays in the Philosophy of Humanism"*. He has been a guest speaker on the *Philosophy of Religion* panel discussion at San Jacinto College. He has also appeared as a panelist on the Houston PBS television program, *The Connection*, discussing religious belief and non-belief.

Our speaker on May 24th will be the Rev. Mike Thompson. His sermon is entitled "Stuck in the Mud" Mud is a marvelous metaphor for all sorts of things. Pigs love it. When we were children, most of us made "pies" out of it. And according to the Bible, God used it to create the first human being. But one thing we really don't want to do is to get "stuck" in it.

Rev. Thompson is a native Texan who grew up in the Piney Woods, and has been a Unitarian Universalist minister for over fifteen years. He first served as a student minister in the Dallas-Fort Worth Area, then as an intern minister in Shreveport, Louisiana. For six years he was a parish minister in Beaumont, Texas. He has also served as a part-time contract minister in Houston and Galveston, and as an interim minister in Canoga Park, California. For the past six years, he has been parish minister of the Unitarian Universalist Congregation of Tuscaloosa, Alabama.


Ministry is a second career for Rev. Thompson. He came to this calling after fifteen years as a high school teacher of history, government, economics and debate. He earned his undergraduate degree in political science and public address from Stephen F. Austin State University in 1974, and his divinity degree from Perkins School of Theology at Southern Methodist University in 1993.

In 1999 he helped organize the Beaumont Chapter of Parents, Families and Friends of Lesbians and Gays (PFLAG). In 2005 he helped organize the Tuscaloosa Chapter of Americans United for Separation of Church and State. In 1998 he received the CUUPS Fuller-Thoreau Award "for spirited defense of religious freedom," and in 1999 he received and Anti-Defamation League award "in recognition of outstanding efforts to guard religious liberties for all."

Rev. Thompson and his wife Pamela have been married for 34 years. They are vegetarians who share their home with two feline companions, Swoosie and Xena.

The SPRING 2009 Chalice Lighter Call for the Southwestern Unitarian Universalist Conference has been awarded to the Unitarian Universalist Church of Oak Cliff (UUCOC) in Dallas, TX.

UUCOC is seeking Chalice Lighter support for its Memory and Meditation Garden, which has been designed to meet three separate goals for the community. The garden will provide a space for members to address their end of life concerns and provide a sacred space for survivors to come and reflect. The garden is also intended as a beautiful site for celebration of church events. 
At our February 22nd service, we collected \$245.00 for CASA of Walker County.

Beth and Stuart Williamson recently purchased the "Religulous" DVD by TV commentator/comedian Bill Maher. It's about one hour and forty minutes long.


Paul and Joan Culp will host a get-together for the viewing of this DVD at 2:00 p.m. on Sunday,

First I need to apologize to Anne Staples. She sent me her recommended reading list to me weeks ago, and I lost it. I have searched everywhere and cannot find it. It will probably show up in the black hole that I call the childrens' room.

I mentioned that I learned about several opportunities that I would like to share with the congregation. The first is about pilgrimage opportunities offered by the Unitarian Universalist Partner Church Council, UUPCC. Several times this year, starting in late May, there will be two-week

UU pilgrimages to Transylvania to visit the most significant of the Unitarian historical places such as Torda, Meszko, Gyulaferhervar and Deva. In October there is a ten-day pilgrimage to the Philippines to visit UU congregations located there. For more information visit http://www.uupcc.org/trips.html

In February of this year, a Unitarian-managed orphange, The A. Margaret Barr Children's Village, opened in the Khasi Hills of India. The Children's Village was named after a British Unitarian who spent over forty years ministering to the needs of the people of the Khasi Hills. This orphanage currently houses 14 children and is at maximum capacity. The orphanage is seeking both donations to expand and also permanent sponsors for their children. \$700 will pay for each child's food, clothing, schooling and medical expenses for a year.

The UUPCC has a program entitled "Paths to Partnership". This is a student sponsorship where a person can pay for the education of a child or young adult for elementary school, high school, or college in the Philippines, Transylvania, or India. Expenses vary depending on the level of education and the country. The UUPCC asks that all sponsors commit to the numbers of years necessary to see the child through their education: 6 years for elementary school, 4-6 years for high school or college.
