## Sunday, September 27th

Our speaker will be John Pepper, a UU from Houston. Last year, John recently completed his Master of Divinity degree at the Houston Graduate School of Theology while working full time as an engineer with the federal government's USDOT Office of Pipeline Safety. John began graduate school several years ago after discovering a passion for theology and



religious history. John plans to perform some form of community ministry after retirement in the near future. Our congregation just recently agreed to ask John as our Ministerial Intern for the next two years. John Pepper lives with his partner, Randy Joiner, in Houston, but maintains a lake house in Goodrich. His sermon is entitled "Seasons of Holiness."

Seasons of Holiness – The Islamic tradition will have recently completed the celebration of Ramadan and the Jewish tradition is about to experience their holiest of holidays – Yom Kippur. These religious traditions require deep introspection and reflection during these celebrations. How did these holy celebrations come about and how can we learn and benefit from them? ### Sunday, September 13th

Our service will consist of a new tradition that will occur on the first Sunday after Labor Day: The Water Ceremony Ritual. Every member and friend attending the service is asked to bring a small vial or jar of water to use in the ceremony. This is the first offering of this ritual, and tap water may be used as a symbol of a place or water-

connected event of the past year, which you would like to share. Following our water ceremony, we will enjoy violin duets by Javier Pinell and his wife Naomi Gjevre

Javier Pinell is Assistant Professor of Violin and chairperson of the Strings Area at Sam Houston State University. With a broad teaching experience he also serves on the violin faculty at the Interlochen Center for the Arts in Michigan. As a recipient of the prestigious Theodor Presser Award, Dr. Pinell has done pioneer research on compositions for the violin by contemporary Bolivian composers. As a performer he has traveled extensively including appearances with orchestras in Bolivia, Venezuela, Japan, Germany, Luxemburg, Peru, and throughout the U.S. As a chamber musician, Dr. Pinell is a founding member of the Lindsayan String Quartet.

Naomi Gjevre serves on the faculty at Sam Houston State University, where she teaches violin, chamber music, and performs with the Sam Houston String Quartet. During the summers, Dr. Gjevre also serves on the violin faculty at the Interlochen Center for the Arts. Dr. Gjevre has had a varied career as a performer, scholar, and pedagogue. As a performer, she is a founding member of the Lindsayan



String Quartet. Dr. Gjevre's orchestral experience includes the Savannah Symphony Orchestra, the Tallahassee Symphony Orchestra, and the North Carolina School of the Arts Orchestra with which she toured several European countries including France, Germany, Austria, Switzerland, and Italy.

# **Building Work Day September 26th**



#### **Charitable Giving**

At our September 27th service, we will have a collection to benefit Habitat for Humanity of Walker County. Walker County Habitat for Humanity (WCHFH) is a non-profit Christian organization that helps low-income families own decent, affordable housing. The program is made possible by community financial support, donated materials, and volunteer labor, including labor by the selected family.

## News from the 48th UUA General Assembly

Rev. Peter Morales, senior minister of Jefferson Unitarian Church in Golden, CO, was elected to be the eighth president of the Unitarian Universalist Association of

Congregations (UUA) at the UUA's 48th annual General Assembly (GA) in Salt Lake City. Morales, the first Latino leader of the UUA, received 59% of the vote.

Incumbent Moderator Gini Courter and Incumbent Financial Advisor Dan Brody, both ran unopposed and were re-elected to four-year terms. Two Trustees-at-Large and members of several Association committees and commissions were also elected by congressional delegates. The General Assembly also featured a public witness event in support of immigration reform to benefit all families; a Prom-for-All; and the Ware Lecture, delivered by professor Melissa Harris-Lacewell.



On his aspirations for Unitarian Universalism, Rev. Morales said, "I want to grow our faith, to reach all those people who are looking for non-dogmatic, liberal religious community. I look forward to working with partners in many other progressive and justice-seeking religious groups. There are tremendous issues that we'll be facing in the coming years and we're going to need one another."



#### A Note from Our President

If you think that we are too small to get things done, just reflect for a minute. On August 10, 2008, the congregation approved \$8000 to fund

the construction of the city-required weir on the church property. It was built, under that amount, and we were able to see it in place when we had our first picnic on church grounds on November 2, 2008. On April 8, 2009, the congregation voted to build a structure on the church property. As of the latter part of July, 2009, the structure was dried-in and the kevs were given to Kellev Sigler to paint for ID purposes. On August 6, 2009, the Chalice Lighters Grant was awarded to this congregation. On August 9, 2009, we approved a proposal by John Pepper to hire him as our intern minister. All of that adds up to quite an exciting year!!!

Now that we are starting on another church year, there is a lot to do as we continue on religious journey and on the path to growth of our membership. We are soon to move into our church building, so we need to start some meaningful traditions. Many UU congregations follow an annual Ingathering tradition on the first Sunday after Labor Day that includes a Water Ceremony ritual. Lee and I have enjoyed participating in a water ceremony in three different UU churches and would like the Huntsville UUs to have such a tradition.

The Board has approved the incorporation of a short water ritual along with the musical program that is to be presented on September 13, 2009. Please bring a small vial or jar of water to add to other's collection. Because this is a new ritual for a great number of you, just bring some water from your tap as a symbol of a place or a water-connected event of the past year that you would like to share. The water can represent a far-away place, or your favorite fishing hole, or a wonderful rainstorm here in Huntsville (if anyone can remember a rain storm) where you just enjoyed nature and just being. This ritual is about water

and sharing sustaining us. Please plan to share in this meaningful ritual.

The Board also approved another, very different, ritual for the first service in January. The details of that will be shared later.



#### Message from the Building Committee

I have good news to report. First, the columns have been installed on the porch. Also the center beams have been finished on the inside the building. I encourage you to check it out.



Second, at SWUUSI Susan Smith announced

that the Huntsville UU Fellowship had been selected to receive the Fall 2009 Chalice Lighter grant! What will this mean for us? Well, it means that we will be able to steadily continue our construction! This will be a huge bump upward for us at a time that our funds have been largely depleted due to the construction.

Members and friends already have been outstanding in their generosity. This has allowed us to dry in our structure with no debt whatsoever and we still have some money in the bank. Members and friends have been steadily giving to the building fund on a monthly basis.

The Chalice Lighter grant is not a fixed amount as you may know. It is funded by the individual generosity of UU's throughout the Southwest district. In the past the average amount has run about \$10,000 as I understand it. Sometimes more. By no means can we expect enough to finish our building. That would not be realistic. But we do have good reason to expect that those funds ADDED to our own continued giving will allow us to get much closer to being able to actually occupy and use our building. And the sooner we occupy the sooner we can use the building to benefit the people of Huntsville.

I will be working with Mike Watkins in the very near future to get firm bids for the electrical and heating and cooling. I will be giving you more specific information as we get actual bids. When we collect enough cash to do a segment of work, we will proceed.

Thank you all so very much for making this building program possible. It has been a team effort in so many ways. And the more we do ourselves the more friends will step forward to help us. At SWUUSI we had an offer from a San Antonio band to come do a fundraiser for us, perhaps in early November. Also, a minister in the Austin area offered to come do a program for us. Things are looking very good for us and we appreciate that greatly.
