THE PHELPS FAMILY⁴⁵

First Generation

1. WALITER PHELPS, progenitor, was b. c1639. He gave his age as 67 in 1706 and 79 in 1718. (Banry C. Pedan, Jr., Maryland Deponents, 1634-1799, Family Line Publications, 1991:148) Walter Phelps, the immigrant to MD, may be the Walter, son of Walter Phelps, who was bapt. 16 Oct 1635 at Wells Diocese, Somersetshire, England. (Dwally's Farish Registers, 2:273; note in Phelps material collected by Harry Wright Newman, and deposted in the Southern MD Learning Center, CH Co. Community College, La Plats, MD.)

Walter Phelps m. Elizabeth Benson, sister of George Benson, sometime before 1681. (1672) He was bur. 5 May 1719, and she was bur. 18 Aug 1706, both in All Hallows Parish, AA Co. (AACR: 21)

He may be the Walter Phelps who, with William Godby, glover, on 18 Aug 1660, was bound to Edward Hope, grocer, to serve four years in VA. Feter wilson coldnam, complete Book of Enigrants, 1607-1660, GPC, 1987:467}

He was in MD by 7 June 1673, when Hubert Lambert of South River conv. to him 100 a. of land, part of 500 a. laid out for Ann Covill widow. (AALR 1842:225)

On 18 Sep 1676, he was listed among the debts of Daniel Taylor, of AA Co.{INAC 2:285} [It is not clear whether Phelps was a creditor or a debtor.-RWB]

He had Mark Client bound to him on 13 Oct 1679 for five years in MD. (Coldham, Complete Book of Emigrants, 1661-1699, opc:350)

Walter Phelps, of AA Co., immigrated to MD with his wife Elizabeth and mother Rebecca and three other persons, and in 1680 Phelps claimed land for their transportation. Mark Clyant was one of the three persons. (MPL WC#2:178-179)

On 12 Oct 1684, Phelps patented 200 a. *Phelps' Choice*. (мрт. 25:144,33:97) On 1 Oct 1700, he patented 34 a. *Elk Thicket*. (мрт. pp#5:16, pr#2;3)

On 20 May 1703, Walter Phelps and Sitt.[?] Welsh appraised the estate of John Gather, Sr. (1804)

Walter and Elizabeth (Benson) Phelps were the parents of: WALTER, b. 17 June 1680; WILLIAM, b. 13 Sep 1682; JOHN, b. 1 June 1684; GEORGE, b. 18 May 1689; ELIZABETH, b. May 1693, bur. 18 April 1703 (AACR: 15); BENJAMIN, b. 5 Dec 1695; JOSEPH, b. 9 Aug

2. WALTER PHELPS, Jr., son of Walter and Elizabeth, was b. 17 June 1680, and m. 1st, Mary Cheney on 1 Dec 1702. (AACR: 17) He m. 2nd, on 2 Jan 1717, Rose Bazil. On 27 March 1728, Ralph Bazel, of AA Co., made a will naming "Ruth, [sic] wife of Walter Phelps, Sr." (MNB 19:527)

On 1 April 1701, he wit. the will of George Eastall, of AA Co. (MWB 11:191)

In 1724, Walter Phelps conv. 100 a. Phelps's Choice to Charles Phelps and Susanna (Meek) Phelps, widow of John Phelps. (AALE

In June 1740, Walter Phelps testified in a land commission, giving his age as 61. He was evidently still living in March 1760/1 when, as "Walter Phelps, Sr.," he gave his age as c80.{AALC, 1724-1767:141,552} as "Walter Phelps, Sr.," he gave his age as c80.{ALC, 1724-1767:141,552}

Richard Poole on 24 Feb 1730; ELIZABETH, bapt. 18 May 1719 [If she were a dau. of Walter by his first wife, she could have been b. any time prior to 1717, and bapt. in 1719.].

Walter and Rose/Ruth (Bazil) were the parents of (AACR: 33, 38, 45, 199): BAZIL, son of Walter and Rose [sic], bapt. 18 May 1719; RUTH, bapt. 15 May 1722; WILLIAM, b. 13 July 172-(?), bapt. 21 Oct 1724; and GEORGE, b. 4 July 1730.

8. WILLIAM PHELPS, son of Walter and Elizabeth, was b. 18 Sep 1682, and m. Elizabeth Cheney on 8 Aug 1706. Elizabeth, wife of William, was bur. 12 Sep 1711, and William m. 2nd, Rachel (N) on 11 Dec 1718. (AACR: 22, 31, 198)

In Aug 1738, he dep. in a land commission, giving his age as 56. In Feb 1738/9, he again dep., naming himself "son of Walter." (AMAG, 1724-1767:113, 116)

William Phelps d. leaving a will dated 12 July 1748 and proved 20 Aug 1748, appointing his wife extx., and naming his sons Richard, John, Benjamin, Zachariah, and William. His will named tracts Phath Adventure on Flat Creek Branch, and the Upper Part. Samuel Day, Clark Cromwell, and Elizabeth Cheney were wits. (MRS 25:189)

On 26 Dec 1748, his estate was inv. by Samuel Day and John Coward, and valued at £112.18.1. Walter Phelps and John Phelps

signed as kin, and Mrs. Rachel Phelps, extx., filed the inventory on 12 April 1748. Another inventory was taken on 13 July 1749 by the same appraisers and valued at £23.2.7. Rachel Phelps filed the second inventory on 9 Sep 1749. (MINV 37:441; 40:140)

William had at least two children by his first wife. His others were almost certainly by his second wife. His children were (AACR:23, 29): (N), b. (date of birth not given); and WILLIAM, bapt. 12 Sep 1711. William and Rachel were the parents of: RICHARD, d. intestate

Richard, William, John, and Zachariah (He may be the Benjamin Phelps who took the Oath of Fidelity to the State of MD on 1 March 1778 before Richard Harwood, Jr.)(AARE:151); and ZACHARIAH, b. 8 Oct 1729. (AARE:45)

4. JOHN PHELPS, son of Walter and Elizabeth, was b. 1 June 1684, and d. 1725. He m. Susan Meek on 16 Oct 1718 in All Hallows Parish. After John Phelps' death, she m. 2nd, William Anderson.

On 7 March 1708, John Phelps wit. a deed in AA Co. (AALE PX:22) John Phelps, of AA Co., d. by 25 Sep 1724 when his admx., Susannah Phelps, filed the inventory of his estate,, which had been made by Benjamin Gaither and Joseph Williams. They appraised the personal property at £49.3.9. William and Charles Phelps signed as next of kin. J. Mouatt and Joseph Burton signed as creditors. (MINV 10:199)

Susannah Phelps, admx., admin. the estate of John Phelps on 14 Sep 1725. Payments and disbursements equalled £19.19.2. (MDAD 7:85)

Susanna Phelps was still living on 11 Sep 1733 when she and John, James, Samuel, Christopher, and Ruth Meek were named as the representatives of Mary Rowe, widow of AA Co. Man 12:28)

representatives of Mary Boyce, widow, of AA Co. (Main 12:28)
Susanna (Meek) (Phelps) Anderson d. in AA Co. leaving a will dated 8 Sep 1758 and proved 30 Dec 1766. She named her children John Phelps, James, William, and Absolom Anderson, dau. Mary Stewart, and dau. Jane Waters. The will was wit. by Jeremiah Mullikin, William Nichols, and Joshua Clarke. (MW 35:253)

John and Susanna were the parents of (giles: 41): JOHN, m. (N) Howard.

CHARLES PHELPS, son of Walter and Elizabeth, was b. on 17 Cen 1999, and may have d. between Jan 1770 and March 1772. He m. Central Stephens, on 19 Dec 1723. (AACR: 37) Susanna was probably that by 1789. He m. 2nd, by 12 Aug 1747, Margaret Charnock.

In 1739, Charles Phelps, carpenter, conv. 60 a. *Phelps' Choice* to William Anderson. No wife joined him, so Susanna was probably dead.

(AALE RD#3:150)

On 12 Aug 1747, Charles Phelps and wife Margaret, of AA Co, deeded to Charles Carroll their right to 250 a. of land in BA Co. called Brother's Unity or Expectation. The tract had descended to Margaret from her parents Anthony Charnox and his wife Hannah, who was a dau. of George Hollingsworth. Geo. Hollingsworth d. leaving the tract to his children George, Otho, Charles, James, and Hannah. George, Otho, and Charles s.p., and Hannah m. Anthony Charnox on 14 May 1717 in St. Anne's Parish, AA Co. (PCLR EI#8:339; AACR:80) Margaret Charnock, age 12 in Sep 1737, had been bound the preceding June to William Robinson of Spesutia until she attained the age of 16 (which would be about 1741). (BA Co. Court Proceedings, ENS\$1-A)

On 26 Feb 1748, Charles Phelps patented 50 a. Phelps' Funcy

(MPL TI#4:50, BY#1:599)

Charles Phelps, "being very poor," was provided with £30 in Jan 1770 by the Vestry of St. Anne's Parish. Margaret Phelps was given £30 in March 1772, so Charles may have d.{st. Anne's Vestry Proceedings, Vol. 2, 1767-1818:35, 43}

Charles and Susannah were the parents of AACR: 45): ZEBULON, b. 25 May 1731. By Margaret, Charles was the father of at least one son: WALTER, b. c1750.

6. WALTER PHELPS, son of Walter and Mary (Cheney), was b. on 14 Sep 1703, and d. by March 1764. He m. Mary Bazil on 9 Jan 1727 in All Hallows Parish. (AACR: 42) On 27 March 1728, Ralph Bazel made a will mentioning Mary, wife of Walter Phelps, Jr. (MWB 19:526)

On 18 June 1764, his estate was inv. by Robert Welsh and Gassaway Watkins, and valued at £12.15.0. John Phelps and Mary Poole signed as kin, and George Phelps and Joseph Phelps, execs., filed the inventory on 23 Feb 1765. (MAY 86:145)

It would appear that Walter Phelps was the father of {AACS: 43; ISAIAH, bapt. 23 March 1728 (he was not in his father's will); ELIZABETH, bapt. 13 Dec 1730 (she was not in her father's will); JOHN; GEORGE (in 1767 he and his bros. Isaiah and Joseph conv. 50

a. Covell's Folly, 50 a. Phelps' Luck, and part of Elk Neck to Nicholas Maccubbin) (AALR BB#3:332); and JOSEPH; he was still living in 1767 when he and his bros. conv. land to Nicholas Maccubbin.

7. JOHN PHELPS, son of Walter and Mary Cheney, was b. by 1711, and m. Sarah Bazill on 9 Aug 1730. (AACR: 44)

He is probably the "John Phelps, Sr.," who gave his age as 52 in March 1760/L (AMLC 1724-1767:552)

John and Sarah (Bazil) were the parents of (MACR: 45): JOHN, b. 8

8. BAZIL PHELPS, son of Walter and Rose [sic], was bapt. on 18 May 1719. (AACR: 199) He d. by Oct 1760. His wife Leah was probably a dau. of Edward and Rachel Gaither, and seems to have m. 2nd, (N) Kirkland.

In 1760, Walter Phelps conv. to Basil Phelps 103 a. of Phelps and Daville (Covelled) Rolly taken Basil 335)

Luck and Devil's (Covell's?) Folly (AALR BB#2: 335)

Bazil Phelps left a will dated 12 Aug 1760 and proved 18 Oct 1760, naming his wife Leah, his three sons Edward, Bazil, and Gather, and mentioning an umborn child. His wife was named extx., and the will was wit. by Richard Poole, George Phelps, and William Beard. (ммв 31.67)

On 5 May 1761, his estate was appraised by Joseph Kenard and Benjamin Williams, and valued at £153.19.10. Walter Phelps and George Phelps signed as next of kin, and Leach (Leah?) Phelps, extx., filed the inventory on 7 May 1761. (MINV 74:26)

A second inventory was taken by the same appraisers (but Joseph Kenard was Joseph Howard), and valued at £16.17.0. George and Joseph Phelps signed as kin, and Leah Kirkland, admx., filed the inventory on 12 Nov 1766. (MINV 89:201)

Bazil Phelps was the father of: EDWARD; BAZIL; GAITHER; and (N), (child unb. in Aug 1760; almost certainly ABSOLUTE PHELPS).

9. WILLIAM PHELPS, son of William and Elizabeth, was bapt. 12 Sep 1711, and d. by 30 Oct 1765. He m. Susanna (N). [Some sources say she was Susanna Meek, dau. of John and Mary (N) Meeks, but proof has not been found; see John Phelps #4 above.]

In a letter dated 23 Dec 1993 to the compiler, John H. Pearce, Jr., of Butler, MD, stated that Susanna may have m. 1st, on 23 July 1726, William Anderson, who d. 1741 in AA Co., and had by him five children: William; James, b. c1725 [sic]; Absolom, b. 17 Feb 1737; Jane, m.
