By Vertue of two Warrants from ye Com^{rs} impowerd to grant Lotts and Lands to purchas^{rs} and plant^s in this Province and Territories Bearing date ye 1st of ye 8th moneth 1684, directed to me I hereby Certifie in to ye Govern^{rs} Seretaryes Office that I have Cause d to be Surveyed and Laid out ye 8th of ye 9th Moneth 1684 unto Thomas Philips fourty Acres of Land Within ye County of ye Liberties of ye City of Philadelphia twenty four acres Where of is in Right of Marcy Jefferson Purchas^r of fifteen hundred acres and ye oth^r Sixteen Acres is in Right of Charles Pickring Purchas^r of One Thousand acres - Beginning at marked tree - which tree belongeth to ye Land of John Longhurst and Compy - from thence North North West by a street or Road fifty and six perches and a halfe from thence East North East by a line of marked trees One hundred and thirteen perches to a Corn^r marked post from thence South South East by a Line of marked trees fifty and six perches and a halfe to a Corn^r post belonging to ye Land of John Day and Company - from thence West South West by a Line of marked trees One hundred and thirteen perches to ye first mentioned Corn^r tree Containing and Laid out as above for fourty acres of Land and is accordingly Entreed and Recorded in my Office Philadelphia this 31st day of March 1685
