Early records of the Phelps Family are given here in the hope that some interested, ambitious and able descendant will have the time and money to trace our ancestry back to its origin in America or even further.

In early Colonial times there were at least three separate and apparently distinct Phelps Families in America. The New England group have been well written up by several of their descendants and have also been listed in Virkus. While there is a Carey Phelps in this family, NO connection has thus far been found. (1960)

The Phelps Family of North Carolina, particularly in Tyrrell County were an important Family in that area, and Mr. William Perry Johnston, Editor of the North Carolinian, a Genealogical magazine, has done research on that family. His booklet on this group has been carefully checked but there seems to be no logical connection. (1958)

The Maryland Phelps family and those of Virginia have very similar Family names and it is possible that there is a relationship, but so little work has been done on that group that we cannot find any provable relationship.

Nugent--Cavaliers and Pioneers. Edward Hudson--356 Acres Rappahannock Co. Va. for transportation of eight persons--among these was JOSEPH PHELPS.

Same Ref. Thos. Robinson and T. Sherman for trans. of 16 persons, among whom was RICHARD PHELPS.

Same Ref. A. Bayley and T. Crosby, Henrico Co. for trans. of persons among whom was ROBERT PHELPS. Jan. 1637.

Under date of Nov. 16, 1907, Mr. A. C. Quisenberry, of Washington, D. C. wrote, "The first Virginia Phelps I have been able to find records of, was WILLIAM PHELPS, who came from Somersetshire, England, in 1685. I find nothing about him in Virginia, except the fact of his arrival. He was one of the soldiers who fought in the Duke of Monmouth's Rebellion against James II. and was tried and transported to Virginia with many other good men." (From the papers of Mrs. Frank Jennings. (I have not found this record. N. R. Roy)

Westmoreland Co. Wills, by Crozier. p. 5. gives THOMAS PHELPS, Will, Apr. 16, 1669, p. May 31, 1671, gives to ANN, his wife, all his estate.

History of Talbot Co. Maryland, p. 12 & 204--Cuthbert Phelps had 400 acres surveyed, Aug. 11, 1659, which was called "Cudlington." The fourth Court held, was at Ottwell, the house of Mr. Wm. Taylor, Nov. 25, 1662, when Cuthbert Phelps took the oath of Constable.

Baldwin's Calendar of Wills--Vol. I. Edward Roe, Talbot Co. Md. dated 4. March, 1675, probated July 3, 1676. "To Thomas Duncan, son of testator's wife, and heirs. "Bachelor's Plantation" bought of Thomas Phillips, Island Creek. To Anne Gorsuch and rest of Richard Gorsuch's children, personality. To wife, Mary, $\frac{1}{2}$ real estate during widowhood. To dau. Eliza; etc.....Said estate to pass to Thomas Duncan, aforesaid, should said Eliza die without heirs. (Note: Thos. Duncan, d. ca. 1693, unmarried, but Eliza m. and had children) Exers: wife, Mary, Capt. Philemon Lloyd, Capt. Peter Sayre, Richard Gorsuch. Test: Thos. Alexander, Wm. PHELPS, Thomas Morris, Joseph Hicks.

(Note: Mary Phelps m. Mr. Duncan and it seems likely that the Wm. Phelps who witnessed the will was her brother. All of this took place in Talbot Co. hence it is likely that these Phelps were relatives of Cuthbert Phelps.

Annapolis Test. Proceedings 9:23--show that Richard Gorsuch died ca. late 1676 and that in 1680 his living children were Mary, Richard, Elizabeth and Sarah. Mary had married Richard Keene before 1680.

In Prerog. Ct. Estate of Edward Roe, Mar. 12, 1682, is a statement that "Anne(Gorsuch)(dau. of Richard Gorsuch) d. unmarried prior to Mar. 12, 1682." This is also stated in Vol. 24, (1916) Va. Mag. of History and Biography, p. 322. (Stout Lillard, Washington, D. C.)

Va. Hist. Mag. Vol. 19, p. 30. Thomas Phelps, Master of the Dolphin of Bristol, was bonded for 1000 pounds, May, 1666. This appears to have been the Thomas Phelps who died in Ann Arundel Co. Md. in 1674, whose wife was Eleanor. His inv. shows he was a master seaman. Eleanor seems to have been the dau. of Matthew Howard and his 1st wife, therefore a half-sister of Cornelius Howard. She married Wm. Fergusson, and died before she had time to adm. the estate of her first husband, Thomas Phelps. It was adm. by Wm. Fergusson. (Hall of Rec. Liber 9: Folio 44, Test. Proc. 16 March 1676) Wm. Fergusson of adm. of goods, debts, etc. of Thomas Phelps, late of Anne Arundel Co. unadministered by Elinor, the said Fergusson's wife, etc..... formerly paid to Lancelot Todd, who married the Only daughter of the said Phelps, etc..... Sarah Phelps married Lancelot Todd.

There is nothing in the records of the adm. of the estate of Thomas PHELPS to indicate that there was ANY OTHER CHILDREN than the above mentioned Sarah who married Lancelot Todd. Nor have any others been found.

These records show conclusively that Anne Gorsuch died before marriage and that there is NO Phelps-Gorsuch lineage line as given in some previous records.

292 WALTER PHELPS, SR. was bur. May 5, 1719--Baptismal notices--on May 13, 1719, of WILLIAM PHELPS--Rachel, wife of Wm. Phelps; and on the 18th of WALTER PHELPS and others.

72 WILLIAM PHELPS, m. Aug. 8, 1706, Elizabeth Cheney (Banns pub.)

83 WILLIAM, son of Wm. & Elizabeth, bp, Sept. 12, 1711

From these records it seems clear that the WILLIAM PHELPS whose will was filed in 1748, in Ann Arundel Co. Maryland, was the same William Phelps, who m. Elizabeth Cheney in 1706, and m. (2) Rachel, in 1718. (Ref. Maryland Will Bk. 25, p. 94 & 389) This will names sons, Richard, John, Zachariah, William and Benjamin. None of the children named in this Will would be old enuf to be the father of THOMAS PHELPS of Albemarle who died in 1751.

There are many Phelps records in All Hallows Parish but no connection with THOMAS PHELPS of Albemarle County, has been found.

In the name of God, Amen, I, William Phelps being weak in Body but in sound & perfect Memory do make this my last Will and Testament in manner and form as followeth:

Ist I give and bequeath to my Loving Brother in law, William Baber, Two Hundred acres of Land on Nell Moore's Creek of Slate River joining John Sharp's Line to him & his heirs.....

I give and Bequeath to my Loving Father, THOMAS PHELPS & to my Loving Brother, THOMAS PHELPS, JUNR. all the rest & residue to my Estate.... in trust never the less to be equally Divided by them between my two sons, JAMES PHELPS & WILLIAM PHELPS & their heirs forever and for no other intent or Purpose whatsoever & do ordain and appoint my said Father and Brother(in law) executors of this my last will.....

(Note: Albemarle Co. Va. was cut from Goochland Co. Va. in 1744. There are no marriages recorded in Albemarle Co. Va. before June 4, 1781, when Lt. Col. Tarleton Raided this County & Town and destroyed or took away, ALL the marriage Bonds & many other records. J. T. G.)

This Will establishes the FACT that William Phelps was a son of Thos. Phelps, Sr. and brother to THOMAS, JOHN, Mary Phelps Patterson and Phelps Given, as shown in the Will of his father, THOMAS PHELPS, SR.

Deed Bk. 6. p. 17--JAMES PHELPS, of the County of Bedford and Elizabeth, his wife, on April 12, 1772, deed to Robert Carter Nicholas of

the City of Williamsburg, two tracts of land granted to William Phelps, father of said James Phelps, by Patents dated April 1, 1749, the one tract containing 400 acres, the other 350 acres, lying in the County of Albemarle.

William Phelps is listed in Buckingham Co. Va. in Fothergill's --Tax-payers, 1782, as having one poll and 8 slaves.

1751 WILL OF THOMAS PHELPS

In the name of God, Amen, I Thomas Phelps of Albemarle County, being weak in Body but in sound & perfect memory do make this my last Will and Testament in manner & form as followeth:

Item: I give my soul to God as gave it.....

Item: I lend unto my Loving wife, Elizabeth Phelps, During her widowhood, all my whole Estate Real and Personal.

Item: I give and Bequeath unto my loving son, Thomas Phelps, Three Hundred acres of Land lying on both sides of Bridle Creek joining his own lines to him & his heirs forever.

Item: I give and Bequeath unto my loving son, John Phelps, the Plantation whereon I now Dwell & the Islan I now tend in and three hundred acres of Land on both sides of Hunt's Creek joining Nicholas line to him and his heirs forever.

Item: I give & Bequeath to my Loving Daughter, Mary Patterson one shilling sterling.

Item: I give & Bequeath unto my Grand Daughter, Joyce Patterson & my Grandson, Peter Patterson--Betwixt them both one child's part. It is my Will and Desire that all my Personal Estate shall be Equally Divided among all my children Except my Daughter, Mary Patterson, & my will and Desire is that my Estate shall not be appraised enduring my wife's time & I do appoint & ordain my son, Thomas Phelps & son-in-law, Richard Given to be Executors of this my last Will & I do by these presents revoke.....

Signed, Sealed & Delivered to be his last will & Testament in Presence of us.

At a Court held for Albemarle County, the 14th Day of May, 1751, this last Will & Testament of Thomas Phelps, dec'd was proved.....

No proof has been found as to the maiden name of Elizabeth Phelps, wife of Thomas, Sr. Mrs. Jennie T. Grayson states that the wife of Thomas Phelps, Jr. was a Miss Moore, but gives no proof. Mrs. Caperton gives Sarah, dau. of Capt. Geo. Guy as the wife of Thomas, Jr. but no proof is given.

"Henrico County, Virginia, at first included Albemarle on the North side of the James River and Cumberland on the south which was formed from it. Lunenburg Co. was formed from Brunswick, and Bedford from Lunenburg. John Phelps was one of the first Justices of Lunenburg Co. in 1745." (W.G. Stanard) This John was NOT John, son of Thomas, Sr.

Grant to Thomas Phelps by George II, by Grace of God, of Great Britain, France, Ireland, King Defender, know ye that we do grant and confirm unto Thomas Phelps, one certain tract of land, etc....signed, Wm. Gooch, Lieut. Gov. and Commander in Chief of our said Colony and Dominion Williamsburg, under seal of said Colony, 28th of Aug, 1746, in the 20th year of our reign.

Thomas Phelps of Tillotson Parish, Albemarle Co. Oct. 18, 1760, makes a deed to Thomas Turpin of Southam Parish of Cumberland for and in consideration of 200 acres of land, both bargain and sell 75 acres in the said county on both sides of Bridle Creek and bounded as follows by Thomas Phelps land--signed and delivered in the presence of David Patterson, Charles Patterson, Thos. Nelson and Richard Cheatwool. D.B. 2.

Tillotson Parish became Tillotson Parish of Buckingham Co. and among the Tithables in Buckingham Co. in 1773 were Thomas and Josiah Phelps Neither were there after 1773 but John Phelps and a Richard and Wm.

Phelps were there in 1773 and 1774.

WILL OF THOMAS PHELPS, Will Bk. A. p. 145, Bullitt Co. Ky.

In the name of God, Amen, I, Thomas Phelps, being in my right mind,
tho weak in body, do make this my Last Will and Testament as followeth:
I give and bequeath to my grand-daughter, Cordelia Brashear, one heif-
er to her and her heirs forever; my granddaughter, Cynthia Williams,
my young bay mare and six pounds to her and her heirs forever; I give
and bequeath to my grandson, John Williams, one cow and calf to him
and his heirs, forever; I give and bequeath to my three sons, Anthony,
Edwin and Guy Phelps, my plantation and tract of land where I now live,
the same to be equally divided between the sons; should any prior
claim arise to any part the residue to be equally divided.

I give and bequeath what cash I have to my three sons, Anthony, Edwin
and Guy, equally. The residue of my estate to be equally divided bet-
ween my three sons, and daughters, Anthony, Edwin, Guy and Sarah and
lastly it is my wish that my three sons, Anthony, Edwin and Guy Phelps
be executors to this my Last Will and Testament.

In witness whereof, I have set my hand and seal this 5 March, 1797.

Samuel Simmons, Susannah Pope, William Brashear

After lingering at the Falls of the Ohio for a few years, Thomas and
his younger sons, Guy, Edwin and Anthony, and his daughters, Lucy Bra-
shear and Elizabeth Williams, went to Nelson County, Ky. in that part
which was later Bullitt Co. and took up large grants of land, this
time granted by the State of Virginia.

Meanwhile two older sons, Josiah and George and their wives had gone
back to Madison Co. where they had succeeded in re-establishing the
claim to the 1400 acres granted by the Henderson Co. of No. Car. Cor-
nelius and Sarah Lucas went to Hardin Co. Ky. in 1797, with Wm. Lucas
(probably father of Cornelius) William bought 600 acres of land in
that Co. at that time; soon sold 100 A. to Cornelius. This land was

on the Nolin River. (I think this land is now in La Rue Co. Ky----
Helen Wallace)

Thomas Phelps entered 400 A--Jan. 14, 1780 on Otter Creek in Jefferson
County. (Jillson, p. 270)

Will of JOHN PHELPS x (sick) to son JOHN, the use of the land where he

MARY, granddaughter, SARAH, etc. Wife, Margaret. Dated Feb. 14, 1747,

already been given property, and then he gives unto Bryan Bayley, Jr.
land at Phelps' Fort. (I have photostat of Mark's Will. N. R. Roy)

132, Wm. & Mary Quarterly.)

Annals of Platte Co. by Paxton, p. 40. Aug. 1, 1851, Edward P. Duncan, appointed adm. for the estate of Thomas Phelps, bond \$30,000. Thomas Phelps lived near New Market, and was a man of wealth and ability.

Thomas Phelps lived in a beautiful two story colonial brick house near where the present Drais House is--now owned by the Stagg Family. This property became the home of James Drais, I. after Mr. Phelps' death. The old PHELPS SCHOOL was on the southwest corner of this property and there I first went to school (N. R. Roy) The brick house was largely destroyed by a cyclone about 1890 but what was NOT destroyed is still there and used as a storage shed. There was an old Family Cem. near but no stones with Phelps name could be found in 1954. A picture of the two story brick taken before the cyclone is now in the possession of Mrs. W. A. Shattuck of Ashland, Kas. great-granddau. of James Drais, I. the purchaser after the death of Mr. Phelps.
