

Man arrested in Subway robbery

Ruston police officers arrested a Georgia man today and charged him with the armed robbery of the Subway restaurant on Cooktown Road in October.

Officers arrested Brad Sterling Lee, 25, of Haphzibah, Ga., at a residence on Barnett Springs Road this morning, said Curtis Hawkins, spokesman for the Ruston police department.

Ruston police responded to a call about an armed robbery at the Subway restaurant on Oct. 6.

Subway employees told police that a man in dark clothing

walked in, showed a handgun and demanded money before he forced them to walk into the cooler in the back of the restaurant. The man then stole money from the restaurant and fled the scene. The armed robber left without hurting any of the employees, Hawkins said.

Police obtained a warrant for Lee's arrest on Wednesday, Hawkins said.

Officers took Lee to the Lincoln Parish Detention Center and charged him with one count of armed robbery. His bond was set at \$250,000.

"Investigators are still continuing to investigate this matter, and additional arrests are pending," Hawkins said.
