Man sought after robbery

A man armed with a handgun robbed the Sabine State Bank on North Trenton Street in Ruston Tuesday afternoon, and members of the Ruston Police Department were still looking for him this morning.

The unidentified man walked into the bank in the early afternoon hours, took out a handgun and demanded money. He left with an undetermined amount of cash, said Lt. Curtis Hawkins, spokesman for the Ruston Police Department, in a statement.

Local law enforcement agencies searched the area surrounding the bank, but they didn't find the suspect, whom they described as a black male with a medium build, Hawkins said.



Ruston police did not have any other information to release about the bank robbery as of this morning, Hawkins said.

Police ask anyone with information about the crime to call Crime Stoppers at 255-1111. Crime Stoppers will pay up to \$2,000 for information leading to the arrest and conviction of the suspect.
