

# Tech Bulletin

Each week, or nearly each week, TLS distributes an e-mail bulletin discussing security issues, new technologies, and legal or cultural matters concerning computers and the internet. The TLS bulletin is aimed at providing critical information to novice or average computer users presented in an easily understood manner. TLS provides links to source materials, a brief description, and a recommendation, if necessary. The typical Tech Bulletin contains ten briefly encapsulated matters that can be reviewed in a short amount of time.

For people who do not review technological issues on a daily basis, the tech bulletin can be a critical source of information for virus outbreaks, flawed patches from major vendors, Windows Update problems, internet scams, new - mostly free - technologies, and other matters impacting productivity.

The concept of distributing a tech bulletin arose from the fact that many colleagues and associates share the same questions and concerns about internet security and privacy. Busy legal and business professionals who use computers on a daily basis often don't have the time to learn how to use their computers safely and efficiently. TLS believes that internet security is only as strong as the weakest link and that educating colleagues with whom TLS does business is necessary to protect TLS, and TLS's clients, from electronic threats.
