Addictive Cereal Mix

Lou Pack

Syrup mixture:

1 1/2 C. light brown sugar 3/4 C. butter 3/4 C white karo syrup 1 teaspoon vanilla

Bring the above to a boil and remove from heat.

In a large roasting pan, mix together:

1 box Honey nut bitz

1 box Cinnamon Crispix

1 lb. pecan halves

Mix with the syrup and place in a 250°F oven for 1 hour, stirring every 15 minutes.

Pour out onto wax paper and spread to cool. Store in air-tight container. Makes a lot, but goes quickly. Enjoy

Pecan Delight

Crust: 1 cup chopped pecans

1 cup flour ½ cup butter

Mix together until crumbly. Pat in bottom of 9 x 13" pan. Bake at 350°F for 15 -20 minutes.

Cream Cheese Layer: 1 8 oz. pkg cream cheese (Softened)

1 cup confectioners' sugar

½ of 8 oz container of Cool Whip

Beat together until smooth and spread on crust.

Pudding Layer: 2 small pkgs instant pudding (Lemon, or Chocolate or Butterscotch)

3 cups milk

Mix until smooth. Spread on cream cheese layer

Topping: Cool Whip sprinkled with a few nut pieces.

Ramen Noodle Cole Slaw

Salad

1 lb cole slaw mix 2 oz slivered almonds

½ cup sunflower seeds ¼ cup dried chopped chives

2 pkgs Ramen Noodles (chicken flavored) (uncooked and crushed)

Mix salad ingredients.

Dressing

½ Cup Sugar½ Cup oil (I use extra light olive oil)1/3 cup cider vinegar2 seasoning packets from noodles

Mix dressing ingredients in saucepan and cook until sugar is dissolved. DO NOT BOIL! Pour over salad and stir.

Enchilada Soup

This is a really "difficult" recipe so be sure to block off a large amount of time from your busy schedules to make it.

1 can enchilada sauce

1 can cream of chicken soup

1 can fiesta nacho soup

1 can chicken (large can)

1 small can chilis

milk (to suit)

tortilla chips

sour cream

Open enchilada sauce, soups, chicken and chilis and dump in pot, slow cooker of microwave safe container. Add milk. Heat through and serve with chips (crumble in) and top with sour cream.

(Double recipe to make in crock pot.)

Dump Cake Nancy Sealey

1 (20 oz) can crushed pineapple w/juice, undrained

1 (21 oz) can cherry pie filling

1 package Duncan Hines moist deluxe yellow cake mix

1 cup chopped pecans or walnuts

½ cup (1 stick) butter or margarine, cut into thin slices

Preheat oven to 350°F. Grease 9x13 pan.

Dump pineapple with juice into pan. Spread evenly. Dump in pie filling. Spread evenly. Sprinkle cake mix evenly over cherry layer. Sprinkle pecans over cake mix. Dot with butter. Bake 50 minutes or until top is lightly browned. Serve warm or at room temperature.

Crock Pot Stuffed Cabbage Soup

1 tablespoon olive oil

1 1/2 lb lean ground beef

1 onion, finely chopped

28 oz tomato juice or crushed tomato

2 beef bouillon cubes

2/3 cup barley (rinsed and uncooked)

2 – 3 teaspoons splenda or sugar

2 - 3 teaspoons sweet paprika

1 - 2 tablespoon garlic cloves

1 teaspoon pepper

¼ teaspoon tabasco sauce (2 shakes)

2 lb cabbage, coarsely chopped (1 med head)

3 (14 ½ oz) cans beef broth

In a pot, warm the oil over medium heat and sauté beef and onions until onions are soft and beef is browned.

Drain off the fat and add the tomatoes, bouillon, barley, sugar, paprika, garlic, pepper and Tabasco. Mix well.

Put the cabbage in the crock pot, and top with meat mixture (do not stir). Top with beef broth. Cover and cook on low for 9 hours.

Stir soup well. Continue to cook covered on low for another hour.
