#### Recipes

#### Mock Olive Garden Zuppa Toscana

Serves 8. Prep time: 15 minutes Cook time: 30 minutes Total time: 45 minutes

1 pound Italian sausage

2 large russet baking potatoes sliced in half and then in 1/4 inch slices

1 large chopped onion

1/2 can. Oscar Meyer Real Bacon Bits (these are less fatty than real bacon)

2 cloves garlic, minced

2 cups chopped kale or Swiss chard

2 14.5 ounce cans chicken broth

1 quart water

1 cup heavy whipping cream (I use 1/2 & 1/2)

Cook sausage in a 300-degree oven for approximately 1/2 hour; drain on paper towels and cut into slices. Place onions, potatoes, chicken broth, water, and garlic in a pot and cook on medium heat until potatoes are done. Add sausage, bacon, salt, and pepper to taste and simmer for another 10 minutes. Turn to low heat; add kale and cream. Heat thoroughly and serve.

#### **Grandma's Harvard Beets (AllRecipes.Com)**

34 Cup White Sugar1/4 teaspoon salt1/3 Cup White Vinegar1/4 teaspoon pepper1/3 Cup Water3 tablespoons butter

5 teaspoons corn starch 2 (14 oz.) cans sliced beets drained

In a saucepan, combine the sugar, cornstarch, vinegar and water. Bring to a boil, and cook for 5 minutes. Add the beets to the liquid, and simmer for 30 minutes over low heat. Stir in butter, salt and pepper and remove from the heat. Serve warm or chilled.

### **Mountain Dew Apple Dumplings**

2 (8-count) cans crescent rolls 1 ½ Cups Sugar 4 tart apples, peeled and sliced into 16 wedges 1 teaspoon cinnamon

1/2 cup butter, melted 1 12 oz can Mountain Dew soda

Spray 13×9-inch dish with cooking spray. Separate dough into 16 triangles. Place apple quarter on shortest side of each triangle. Roll up each, starting at shortest side, and rolling to opposite point. Place point side down in prepared pan.

In small bowl, stir together melted butter, sugar and cinnamon; spoon evenly over crescent-wrapped apples. Pour Mountain Dew over all.

Bake at 350°F. for 35 to 45 minutes or until apples are tender. Serve warm with sauce. Top with whipped cream or vanilla ice cream if desired. Makes 16 dumplings.
